Report on the audit of the Standalone Financial Results

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Standalone Financial Results of Talbros Automotive Components Limited ('the Company') for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2026 ('the Statement'), attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirements of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (as amended) ('Listing Regulations').

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid Statement:

- (i) are presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations, and

- The above standalone financial results for the quarter and year ended on 31 March 2026 have been reviewed and recommended for approval by the Audit Committee and accordingly approved by the Board of Directors of Talbros Automotive Components Limited ("the Company") at their respective meetings held on 20 May 2026 and "Audited" by the Statutory Auditors of the company. Mr. Anuj Talwar, MD is duly authorised by Board to sign the financial results for submission to stock exchanges.
- These standalone financial results are prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles of Indian Accounting Standards as notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 as specified in Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013. The figures for the quarter ended 31 March 2026 and 2025 are the balancing figures between the audited figures in respect of full financial year and the published year to date figures upto the third quarter of the relevant financial year, which were subject to limited review.
- The Company has acquired 26% Equity Share Capital of CleanMax Kaziranga Private Limited (a special purpose vehicle to set up grid connected captive solar power project) to obtain solar power for captive consumption by its manufacturing units in the state of Haryana by investing Rs 337.49 Lacs.
- On November 21, 2025, the Government of India notified provisions of the Code on Wages, 2019, the Industrial Relations Code, 2020, the Code on Social Security, 2020, and the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 which consolidate 29 existing labour laws into a 'unified framework governing employee benefits' during employment and post-employment. The Ministry of Labour & Employment published draft Central Rules and FAQs to enable assessment of the financial impact due to the new Labour Codes. The impact has been factored under provisions in balance sheet and expensed under employee benefit expenses:

Note:

- The above consolidated financial results for the quarter and year ended on 31 March 2026 have been reviewed and recommended for approval by the Audit Committee and accordingly approved by the Board of Directors of Talbros Automotive Components Limited ("the Company") at their respective meetings held on 20 May 2026 and Audited by the Statutory Auditors of the company. Mr. Anuj Talwar, MD is duly authorised by Board to sign the financial results for submission to stock exchanges.
- Talbros Automotive Components Limited ("the Company") and its joint ventures are together referred as "the Group" in the following notes. These consolidated financial results are prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles of Indian Accounting Standards as notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 as specified in Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013. The figures for the quarter ended 31 March 2026 and 2025 are the balancing figures between the audited figures in respect of full financial year and the published year to date figures upto the third quarter of the relevant financial year, which were subject to limited review.
- The Company has acquired 26% Equity Share Capital of CleanMax Kaziranga Private Limited (a special purpose vehicle to set up grid connected captive solar power project) to obtain solar power for captive consumption by its manufacturing units in the state of Haryana by investing Rs 337.49 Lacs.
- On November 21, 2025, the Government of India notified provisions of the Code on Wages, 2019, the Industrial Relations Code, 2020, the Code on Social Security, 2020, and the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 which consolidate 29 existing labour laws into a 'unified framework governing employee benefits' during employment and post-employment. The Ministry of Labour & Employment published draft Central Rules and FAQs to enable assessment of the financial impact due to the new Labour Codes. The impact has been factored under provisions in balance sheet and expensed under employee benefit expenses:
